THE PROJECT

Through "I Am a Leader", Youth on Board aims to equip participants with essential leadership skills in addition to soft skills such as time management, teamwork, communication, public speaking, etc. With this action we will provide participants with these skills while offering them a once in a lifetime opportunity to travel across Europe, plan their routes, meet new people, experience new cultures and see new places.

OBJECTIVES

GREEN TRAVEL

The main objective of this project, aside from providing participants with leadership abilities and soft skills, is to promote GREEN TRAVEL using Europe's railway system. Each day hundreds of planes pass over our skies polluting our air. Through train travel carbon emission is lowered.

Another key objective is promoting youth interconnectedness across Europe. What is a better way of doing this then travel? Through the project participants will engage with different cultures, traditions, types of people with diverse backgrounds, try different cuisines and drinks. This will enrich the youth's cultural awareness raising inclusivity.

The group began their journey on 26th of November early in the night. They started from Shtip and rode till Sofia, where they caught their first train to Gorna Oryahovitsa.


Gorna Oryahovitsa




The second leg of the journey

The goal behind the implementation of this project is to help youngsters develop as leaders while traveling Europe. For Budapest, the objective of the group as investigators was to talk with locals and find out more about Hungarian history and culture. As each person took a turn, they formed opinions, shared thoughts and gained new knowledge. Together they developed as a group and laid the foundations for their leadership journey as they all took an initiative to talk, investigate, plan and gather facts.



- The architect went blind before its completion;

- It is not that old;

After hours of walking and exploring, we returned to the center and decided to ride the trolley that has a beautiful view of the whole city."






LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

SchonnBrunn Palace (Ivo's journey)

It was initially a hunting lodge;
Birthplace of queen Marie Antoinette;
It has 1,441 rooms and 41 are open;

Belvedere Palace (Stefanija's journey)

Almost destroyed by WWII bombings; Showcases the best of Austrian art; Summer Home of Prince Eugene; Eugene's niece refused the Palace;

St. Stephen's Cathedral (Liljana's journey)

It is inspired by gothic architecture; Was burned in the Battle of Vienna in April 1945 and then reconstructed; Most popular tourist place in Vienna;

The oldest part is the Swiss Wing and it belonged to Duke Albert;

Museum Quartier (Sara's journey)
